



5-Day Devotional: “Here am I. Send me.”

Isaiah 6:1–8

Day 1 — When the Throne Feels Empty

Scripture: “In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne...” — Isaiah 6:1

Reflection: Isaiah saw the Lord in a year of uncertainty. An earthly king had died. A familiar season had ended. The nation was standing at a threshold.

But the first thing Isaiah saw was not the problem. He saw the Lord.

Threshold moments can make us feel anxious. We want a plan. We want control. But often, the first thing God gives us is a fresh vision of Himself. Before we ask, “What should I do next?” we may need to ask, “Lord, help me see You again.”

Takeaway: Discovering God’s call begins with a fresh vision of who God is.

Reflection Questions:

- Where do I feel like I am standing at a threshold right now?
- What am I tempted to look at first: the uncertainty, or the Lord on His throne?

Prayer: Lord, when life feels uncertain, lift my eyes back to You. Give me a fresh vision of Your holiness. Amen.

Day 2 — When God Shows Us the Truth

Scripture: “Woe to me!” I cried. “I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips...” — Isaiah 6:5

Reflection: When Isaiah saw God clearly, he saw himself truthfully. God’s holiness exposes what we would rather hide. But His exposure is not meant to shame us. It is meant to prepare us.

Many of us want direction without exposure. Assignment without cleansing. Usefulness without transformation. But God loves us too much to send us unchanged. Before He works through us, He often works within us.

Isaiah said, “I am undone.” His honest confession became the doorway to grace.

Takeaway: Before God sends, He lovingly reveals what needs to be touched.

Reflection Questions:

- What area of my heart, speech, attitude, or fear might God be gently exposing?
- Am I willing to let God search me before I ask Him to send me?

Prayer: Lord, give me courage to be honest before You. Search me with Your mercy. Show me what needs to be cleansed, healed, softened, or surrendered. Amen.

Day 3 — Touched by Grace Before Sent by God

Scripture: “See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for.” — Isaiah 6:7

Reflection: Isaiah did not cleanse himself. God cleansed him. That is grace.

The coal touched the very place Isaiah had named as unclean: his lips. The place of unworthiness became the place God prepared for His use. That may be true for us too. If God is going to use our words, He may first cleanse our speech. If He is going to use our leadership, He may first deal with our pride..... If He is going to use our witness, He may first confront our fear. He sends us because we have been touched by grace.

Takeaway: Before God sends, He convicts, cleanses, and transforms.

Reflection Questions:

- Where do I feel unworthy or weak?
- Could that very place be where God wants to touch me with grace?

Prayer: Lord, thank You that I do not cleanse myself. You cleanse me. Touch the places in me that need Your grace. Prepare me not by my strength, but by Your mercy. Amen.

Day 4 — The Surrendered Response

Scripture: “Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, ‘Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?’ And I said, ‘Here am I. Send me!’” — Isaiah 6:8

Reflection: Isaiah’s response was not casual. It was not ambition. It was the response of a heart that had seen God, been humbled, been cleansed, and touched by grace.

Isaiah did not ask for the full plan; not where God would send him or his assignment. He simply offered himself.

We want God to give us the full map before we say yes. God’s Calling begins not with full clarity, but with surrender.

Takeaway: The godly response to God’s calling is a surrendered heart.

Reflection Questions:

- Am I waiting for full clarity before I say yes to God?
- What would it mean for me to offer God my availability today?

Prayer: Lord, I do not need to understand the whole journey before I trust You. Give me a heart that is available, willing, and surrendered. Teach me to say yes before I know all the details. Amen.

Day 5 — One Calling, Many Assignments, One Response

Scripture: “Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts.” — Hebrews 3:15

Reflection: God’s calling is not first about finding a role, title, or assignment. At the deepest level, every believer shares one calling: to belong to God, love Him, glorify Him, love others, and reflect His purpose in every part of life.

But within that one calling, God gives different assignments in different seasons. But the surrendered response remains the same: “**Here am I. Send me.**”

Some of us may be standing at a threshold right now: A quiet question in the heart: “**What now?**” God is not asking you to understand the whole journey today. He is inviting you to take the next surrendered step.

Takeaway: One calling. Different assignments in different seasons. One surrendered response.

Reflection Questions:

- What assignment, role, or season may be changing in my life?
- What is one surrendered step God may be inviting me to take this week?

Prayer: Lord, my calling belongs to You. My seasons belong to You. My next step belongs to You. Root my identity in Christ, anchor my purpose in Your glory, and make my heart willing to respond: Here am I. Send me. Amen.

Closing Encouragement for the Week

As you move through this week, do not rush to figure everything out.

Start here: **See God. Let Him search you. Receive His grace. Offer Him your yes. Take the next surrendered step.**

One calling. Different assignments. One response: “Here am I. Send me.”
