

# A Love that Requires a Response

## Easter Sunday

### **Monday: Love That Must Be Responded To**

**Scripture:** 1 John 4:8

**Reflection:**

God's love is not passive—it invites a response. Many admire it, talk about it, even celebrate it... but never surrender to it. The resurrection is not just proof of love—it is a call to respond to it.

**Prayer:**

Lord, don't let me just admire Your love—teach me to respond to it.

**Application:**

Where have you acknowledged God's love but not responded in surrender?

### **Tuesday: The Question We All Carry**

**Scripture:** Mark 16:3

**Reflection:**

“Who will roll away the stone?”

We all carry questions, burdens, and situations we cannot move. Yet often, what we fear most—God has already handled.

**Prayer:**

Father, help me trust that You are already at work ahead of me.

**Application:**

Name one “stone” in your life—and surrender it to God today.

## **Wednesday: God Has Already Moved**

**Scripture:** Mark 16:4

**Reflection:**

Before the women arrived, God had already moved the obstacle. Resurrection reminds us: God is never late—He is already working in ways we cannot yet see.

**Prayer:**

Lord, give me eyes to see where You are already moving.

**Application:**

Look back—where has God already moved in your life that you didn't recognize at first?

## **Thursday: From Observer to Participant**

**Scripture:** Mark 16:6–7

**Reflection:**

They came as mourners and left as messengers. An encounter with Jesus always changes your role. Faith is not observation—it is participation.

**Prayer:**

Jesus, move me from watching to walking in Your purpose.

**Application:**

What is one step of obedience God is prompting you to take?

## **Friday: Only Two Responses**

**Scripture:** Revelation 16:9

**Reflection:**

There are only two responses to God's love: repentance or resistance. There is no neutral ground. The question is not if you will respond—but how.

**Prayer:**

Lord, soften my heart. I choose surrender over resistance.

**Application:**

What would full surrender look like in your life right now?
